**ORDER No. 395**  
**DISPOSITION OF SALVAGE OR SURPLUS PROPERTY**

WHEREAS, the Texas Local Government Code authorizes the Commissioners Court of a county to dispose of "salvage property" and "surplus property" under Section 263.152 of the Texas Local Government Code by offering the property as a trade-in for new property of the same general type;

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Comal County acknowledges that Section 263.151 of the Texas Local Government Code defines "salvage property" as personal property, other than items routinely discarded as waste, that because of use, time, accident, or any other cause is so worn, damaged, or obsolete that it has no value for the purpose for which it was originally intended;

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Comal County acknowledges that Section 263.151 of the Texas Local Government Code defines "surplus property" as personal property that (1) is not salvage property or items routinely discarded as waste; (2) is not currently needed by its owner; (3) is not required for the owner's foreseeable needs; and (4) possesses some usefulness for the purpose for which it was intended;


WHEREAS, Section 263.152(a)(2) allows the Commissioners Court to offer salvage or surplus property as a trade-in for new property of the same general type if the Commissioners Court considers that action to be in the best interest of the county; and


WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court recognizes that Comal County Jail possesses property, Livescan Fingerprint Machine, Mobile Unit - Model # TPE 5900-ED, S/N - AEL221001014, and Desktop unit, Model # TP3100ED, S/N - AAK209001977 and all components, that is not salvage property, is not currently needed, is not required for the County's foreseeable needs, and possesses some usefulness for the purpose for which it was intended; and


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Commissioners Court of Comal County hereby determines that this item is surplus property under Section 263.151 of the Texas Local Government Code; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Court determines that said surplus item complies with the requirements of Section 263.152 of the Texas Local Government Code and shall be properly disposed of by trading to Mentalix Fingerprint System.
