Texas Watershed Steward workshop to discuss local water quality

NEW BRAUNFELS — A Texas Watershed Steward workshop on water quality in the Comal River watershed will take place in New Braunfels, presented by the Comal County office of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service and the City of New Braunfels.

The workshop will be at New Braunfels City Hall, 550 Landa St., from 8 a.m. to noon Tuesday, Feb. 7. Although it is free of charge, those planning to attend are asked to register by Thursday, Feb. 2, at <http://tw.s.tamu.edu>.

“We’ll be addressing primarily the Comal River and Dry Comal Creek watersheds, but we also will provide an overview of water quality and watershed management efforts in Texas,” said Troy Luepke, extension agent for agriculture and natural resources at the Comal County extension office. “The information will be relevant for all waters in the region.”

The workshop will include discussion of watershed systems, types and sources of water pollution, and ways to improve and protect water quality, along with a group discussion on community-driven watershed protection and management. It is designed to help Comal County’s watershed residents improve and protect their water resources.

Continuing-education credits will be available for a number of related professions, Luepke said.

“Participating in the Texas Watershed Steward program is a great opportunity to get involved and make a difference in your watershed,” he said.
