Whereas, the members of all Law Enforcement Agencies in Comal County play an essential role in safeguarding the rights and freedoms of Comal County; and



Now, therefore, be it resolved that Commissioners Court of Comal County duly convened and acting in its capacity as the governing body of Comal County does hereby proclaim the week of May 15th through 21st, 2011 as “National Police Week” and calls upon all citizens and upon all patriotic, civic and educational organizations to observe this week as “National Police Week” with appropriate ceremonies and observances in which all of our people may join in commemorating law enforcement officers, past and present, who, by their faithful and loyal devotion to their responsibilities, have rendered a dedicated service to their communities and, in so doing, have established for themselves an enviable and enduring reputation for preserving the rights and security of all citizens.


We further call upon all citizens of Comal County to observe May 15th, 2011, as “Peace Officers Memorial Day” in honor of those law enforcement officers who, through their courageous deeds, have made the ultimate sacrifice in service to their community or have become disabled in the performance of duty, and let us recognize and pay respect to the survivors of our fallen heroes.



