# Proclamation

## Recognizing the 30th Anniversary of the Comal County Crime Stoppers Program

WHEREAS, Comal County Crime Stoppers is celebrating its 30th anniversary of helping to make Comal County a safe place in which to live, work and visit; and

WHEREAS, Comal County Crime Stoppers began in 1986 with a dedicated volunteer board of directors, who created a nonprofit organization that utilizes the community, law enforcement and the media to solve crime and apprehend fugitives while offering anonymity and a cash reward for information leading to an arrest; and

WHEREAS, for the past three decades, the program has helped increase the safety of Comal County residents by leading to the arrest of 988 people, solving 1,160 cases and paying cash rewards of over \$154,160 – all from anonymous tips from the public; and

WHEREAS, the Comal Independent School District utilizes the Crime Stoppers school safety program in all middle schools and high schools, resulting in the removal of drugs, tobacco and weapons, and the reinforcement of a safe environment in which students can learn and excel; and

WHEREAS, residents who witness or have information regarding a crime can call, text or send a web tip anonymously 24 hours per day and can receive a cash reward of up to \$2,000 if the tip leads to an arrest; and

WHEREAS, Crime Stoppers has sought to provide the highest quality of services based on fairness, honesty, integrity and pride for the past 30 years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Comal County Commissioners Court, acting in its capacity as governing body of Comal County, does hereby recognize and congratulate Comal County Crime Stoppers on its 30th anniversary of helping to ensure the safety of Comal County residents. Further, we encourage all Comal County residents to prevent and report crimes by providing helpful information to Crime Stoppers.
