Right Reverend John Kendrick Holy Bishop of San Antonio  
 in the County of Bexar and State of Texas and his successors in office,  
 one acre of land to be used exclusively as a cemetery, said acre  
 of land being situated in the County of Comal in the State of Texas  
 about seven miles South West from San Francisco, and being  
 a part of a 60 acre tract out of Survey No 99 made in name  
 of Francisco Rodriguez, belonging to the State of said Texas,  
 through descent - Beginning about ten acres South from the  
 N. E. corner of said 60 acre tract on the South side of Comal  
 Creek, said acre of land to be said lot set a square fronting  
 the Public Road leading from San Francisco to San Antonio  
 in Bexar and to hold the above described premises, with all and  
 singular the rights and appurtenances thereto in anywise be-  
 longing, unto the said Right Reverend John Kendrick Holy  
 Bishop of San Antonio Texas and his successors in office  
 forever. And I do hereby bind myself and my heirs, successors  
 and administrators, to maintain and forever defend all and  
 singular the said premises unto the said Right Reverend John  
 Kendrick Holy, Bishop of San Antonio and his successors in  
 office against any person whatsoever lawfully claiming or to  
 claim the same in any part thereof.
