### Comal County confirms seven new COVID-19 cases

**FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE, October 2, 2020:**

*NEW BRAUNFELS* — Comal County is reporting seven additional COVID-19 cases today bringing the County's total to 3,493.

Of the seven new cases, one is confirmed and six are probable.

The total number of deceased remains at 116.

There are an additional 34 COVID-19 recoveries in Comal County. The total recovered is 3,259.

The county now has 118 active confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases.

Of them, eight are hospitalized.

On Friday, Comal County hospitals reported caring for four COVID-19 patients; of those, three are in intensive care and two are on ventilators. Not all of these patients are necessarily county residents; likewise, not all county residents hospitalized with COVID-19 are in Comal County hospitals.

As of Friday morning, Public Health has received reports of the following test information:

- 25,437 tests conducted
- 2,754 confirmed cases
- 739 probable cases

**The seven day positivity rate for Friday in Comal County is 6.40%.  
The State of Texas is reporting 7.86% positivity rate today.**

Of the 3,493 confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases in Comal County, the location breakdown is:

### **Probable case definition**

“Probable cases” is a category established by the Texas Department of State Health Services to describe those who do not have a positive PCR test for COVID-19, but meet two of the following three criteria:

- A positive quick-result antigen test
- Experiencing COVID-19 symptoms
- Close contact with a confirmed positive COVID-19 case

A probable case is treated identically to a confirmed case and counts toward the county's positivity rate and total case tally.
