### Comal County confirms 18 new COVID-19 cases

**FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE, October 12, 2020:**

*NEW BRAUNFELS* — Comal County is reporting 18 additional COVID-19 cases today bringing the County's total to 3,568.

Of the 18 new cases, six are confirmed and 12 are probable.

The total number of deceased remains at 120.

There are an additional five COVID-19 recoveries in Comal County. The total recovered is 3,341.

The county now has 107 active confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases.

Of those, four are hospitalized.

On Monday, Comal County hospitals reported caring for eight COVID-19 patients; of those, three are in intensive care and two are on ventilators. Not all of these patients are necessarily county residents; likewise, not all county residents hospitalized with COVID-19 are in Comal County hospitals.

As of Monday morning, Public Health has received reports of the following test information:

- 26,207 tests conducted
- 2,777 confirmed cases
- 791 probable cases

**The seven day positivity rate for Monday in Comal County is 8.27%.**

Of the 3,568 confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases in Comal County, the location breakdown is:

### **Probable case definition**

“Probable cases” is a category established by the Texas Department of State Health Services to describe those who do not have a positive PCR test for COVID-19, but meet two of the following three criteria:

- A positive quick-result antigen test
- Experiencing COVID-19 symptoms
- Close contact with a confirmed positive COVID-19 case

A probable case is treated identically to a confirmed case and counts toward the county's positivity rate and total case tally.
