55 new COVID-19 cases; 274 recoveries reported in Comal County

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE, December 30, 2020:

NEW BRAUNFELS — Comal County is reporting 55 new cases of COVID-19 for a total of 6,177 cases.

10 are confirmed cases and 45 are probable.

The County also confirms another death. A man from Canyon Lake passed away on December 29, 2020.

The County now has 679 active confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases. Of those, 49 are hospitalized.

There are 274 additional COVID-19 recoveries in Comal County. The total recovered is 5,340.

On Wednesday, Comal County hospitals reported caring for 76 COVID-19 patients; of those, 17 are in intensive care and 11 are on ventilators. Not all of these patients are necessarily county residents; likewise, not all county residents hospitalized with COVID-19 are in Comal County hospitals.

As of Wednesday morning, Public Health has received reports of the following test information:

- 42,789 tests conducted
- 3,888 confirmed cases
- 2,280 probable cases
- Nine suspect cases.

The seven-day Molecular positivity rate for Wednesday in Comal County is 21.72%.

The seven-day Antigen positivity rate for Tuesday in Comal County is 18.94%.

Of the 6,177 confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases in Comal County, the location breakdown is:

Residents wishing to be tested for COVID-19 can call the County’s dedicated hotline, 830-221-1120, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday to schedule an appointment.

Testing is only done on Tuesday and Friday, and you must have an appointment.

There is no testing this Friday, January 1, 2021 due to the New Year holiday.

Probable case definition

“Probable case” is a category established by the Texas Department of State Health Services to describe those who do not have a positive PCR test for COVID-19 but meet two of the following three criteria:

- Meets clinical criteria AND epidemiologic linkage with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for SARS-CoV-2.
- Meets presumptive* laboratory evidence.
 - Presumptive* laboratory evidence:
 - Detection of SARS-CoV-2 by antigen test in a respiratory specimen
- Meets vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory evidence for SARS-CoV-2.

A probable case is treated identically to a confirmed case and counts toward the County’s positivity rate and total case tally.

Suspect case definition

A “Suspect case” meets supportive laboratory evidence with no prior history of being a confirmed or probable case. It is also counted towards the total case tally.

Supportive Laboratory Evidence means:

- **Detection of specific antibody in serum, plasma, or whole blood**
- **Detection of specific antigen by immunocytochemistry in an autopsy specimen.**
