Tuesday is Election Day for primary runoffs

NEW BRAUNFELS — Comal County voters will finish the long-delayed process of selecting major-party nominees for the 2020 elections on Tuesday, July 14.

Early voting in the elections ends at 7 p.m. Friday, July 10. Polls will be open in individual voting precincts from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. on Election Day; however, voters registered in Comal County can cast a ballot at any of 12 polling places throughout the county – a smaller number than usual because of the low-turnout nature of primary runoff elections.

The runoffs for the March primaries had been delayed from May because of the COVID-19 pandemic; the Elections Office has worked to ensure the health and safety of voters by implementing new social distancing and sanitation procedures, as well as providing hand sanitizer, disposable styluses and finger coverings for voters.

Through Wednesday, 3,749 Comal County residents had cast ballots in advance of Election Day, and another 2,144 had returned ballots by mail. Roughly 5.5 percent of the county's 108,122 registered voters have a cast a ballot in the runoffs thus far.

Sample ballots, voting-precinct maps and vote center locations can be found at the Comal County Elections webpage, votecomal.com. Two early voting locations – the Comal County Elections Center and CRRC of Canyon Lake – *will not* be available for voting on Tuesday; however, the three other locations open during early voting also will serve as Election Day vote centers.

Republicans countywide will select a nominee for District 5 of the State Board of Education, and those living along Interstate 35 will choose a nominee for District 35 of the U.S. House.

Democrats will select nominees for U.S. Senate and the Texas Railroad Commission.
